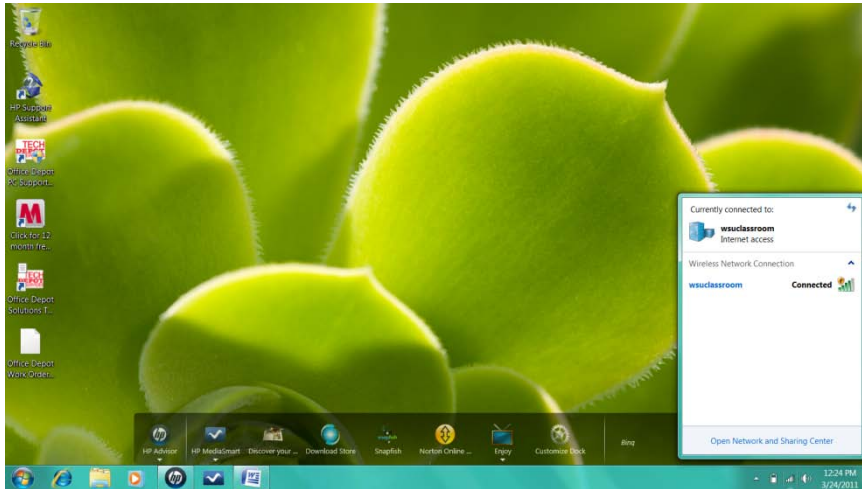


# Cisco Clean Access for Student Laptops

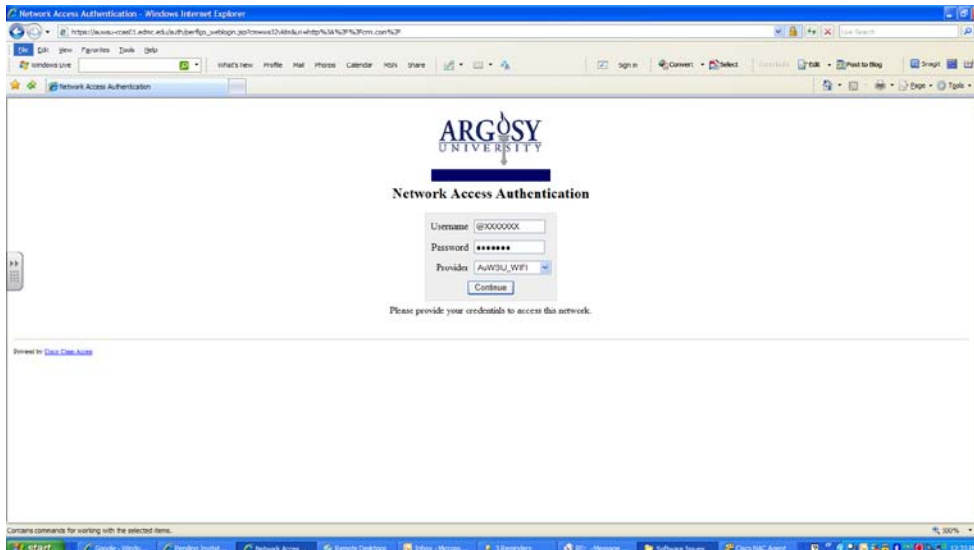
Western State University currently uses Cisco Clean Access to protect its wired and wireless networks. This protects you as students and the University by preventing unauthorized use and access to viruses on the network. Below are instructions for downloading and authenticating on the network.

Students:

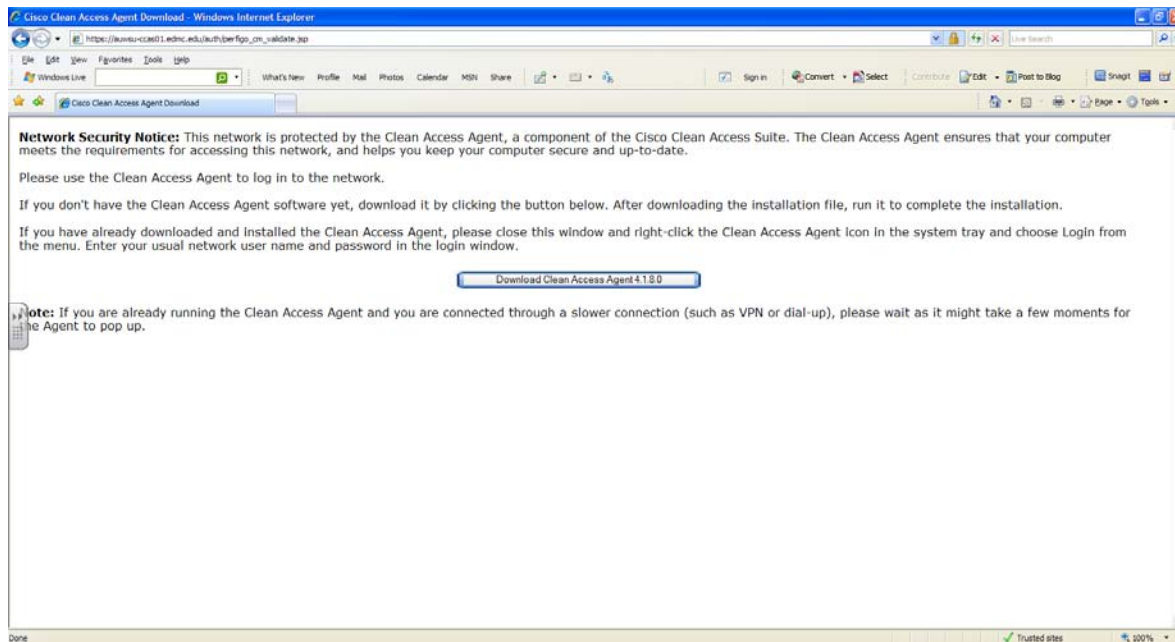
You will need to connect to the wsuclassroom wireless before you are allowed to get onto the wireless network.



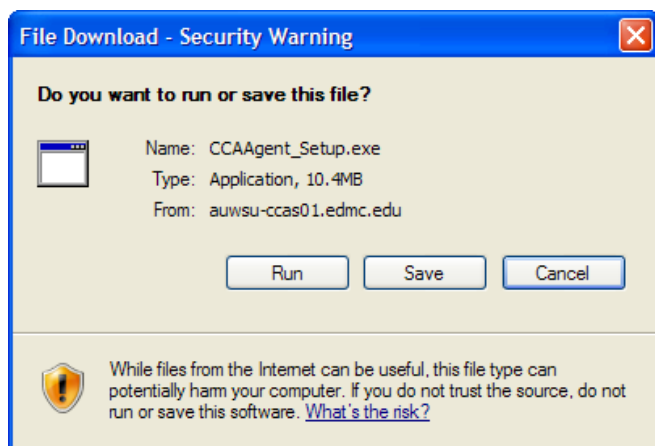
Once you are connected to the network, open up an Internet Explorer browser window. The window should redirect you to a login (see below). Log into the site using your student ID# (@XXXXXXXX) and your password for your account.



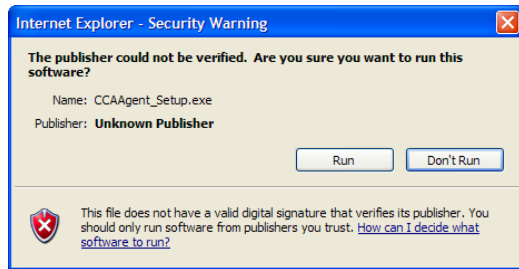
This should prompt you to download Cisco Clean Access as seen below. Click on Download Cisco Clean Access Agent.



Follow the prompts to download and install Cisco Clean Access (Shown below). Click Run.



Another window will appear to ask you to click run. Click Run and then follow and accept the rest of the prompts.



Once installed, a Cisco Clean Access login box should appear automatically similar to the one below.



Once you login successfully, you are connected the Internet. Open an Internet Explorer (or Firefox) to go to the Internet.
